Under immigration law, some non-citizens must be detained and remain in custody—known as mandatory detention—for the duration of their removal proceedings. According to the Immigration and Nationality Act, this happens in cases in which non-citizens have committed certain more serious crimes, such as drug violations, and are thus ineligible for release on bond.
