A statistically significant difference was found on all assessments with the flipped class students performing higher on average. In addition, most students had a favorable perception about the flipped classroom noting the ability to pause, rewind, and review lectures, as well as increased individualized learning and increased teacher availability.

Effects of the Flipped Classroom Model on Student ...

Pan Bingchao [13] studied effects of the flipped classroom on 127 undergraduate students in learning the course: Design and production of multimedia courseware and he found the flipped classroom model could stimulate and maintain college students' learning motivation, cultivate college students' autonomous learning and cooperative learning ability.

Flipped classroom is a "pedagogical approach in which direct instruction moves from the group learning space to the individual learning space, and the resulting group space is transformed into a dynamic, interactive learning environment where the educator guides students as they apply concepts and engage creatively in the subject matter" (The Flipped Learning Network, 2014).

What, Why, and How to Implement a Flipped Classroom Model

At the end of the experimental week, students completed a multiple choice test, resulting in an average score of 41 +/- 1% in the control classroom and 74 +/- 1% in the "flipped" classroom, with an effect size of 2.5 standard deviations.

The Group-Based Flipped Classroom: This model adds a new element to help students learn — each other. The class starts the same way others do, with lecture videos and other resources shared before class. The shift happens when students come to class, teaming up to work together on that day's assignment.

7 Unique Flipped Classroom Models - Panopto

The main goal of a flipped classroom is to enhance student learning and achievement by reversing the traditional model of a classroom, focusing class time on student understanding rather than on lecture. To accomplish this, teachers post short video lectures online for students to view at home prior to the next class session.
