Human-being, for Lacan, is thus (as decentred) vitally a speaking animal (what he calls a *parle-etre*); one whose desire comes to be “inmixed” with the imperatives of, and stipulated within, the natural language of its society. [see Part 2] Particularly, Lacan picks up on certain cues within Freud's texts (and those of Saint Paul) to emphasise the dialectical structuration of human desire in relation to the prohibitions of Law.

Lacan uses the Freudian term, *Verwerfung*, which the "Standard Edition" translates as "repudiation", as a specific defence mechanism different from repression, "*Verdrängung*", in which "the ego rejects the incompatible idea together with its affect and behaves as if the idea has never occurred to the ego at all."
